Though Limbani remained home alone, he wasn't alone for long. He took the opportunity to invite our Chisomo from Thekerani village to stay with him for three weeks while on school break. He is exposing him to some town life, but mostly giving Chisomo the opportunity to have electricity to study, as he will have government exams upon returning to school next week. These exams determine if he will move on to 11-12 grades or not. Pray for him as he studies, and as he takes these exams. We are also still responsible for his school fees as a ministry, so we pray God provides those as well.

We had a blessed time while Mom was with us in Malawi. I trust that during her time she witnessed and experienced many things that can testify to God's work through the ministry there. I also hope that her glimpse into our lives blessed her as much as it did us.
