We are so thankful that our church building in Thekerani is finished! The church there continues to grow and they are all very excited about it. Pray that funds for benches or simple chairs will come so that they do not all have to sit on the floor, or that we do not have to rent chairs from the local school for larger activities.

We are continuing to pray for the timing and funds so that we can obtain land in all of our rural areas so we may build our own churches and not have to pay rent. We would also be able to have tubs or a means to baptize when we have our own church buildings in regions that are not near rivers, such as Bvumbwe and Goliat. Speaking of those places, please pray for growth in those branches and for the faithfulness of the members there.

The people were encouraged to branch out to more of a variety of crops, and were taught ways to help them succeed in growing them. The people were also encouraged not to sell everything they grow in order to buy corn flour to make the staple food, but were encouraged to make what they do grow their new staple food. This is what we believe to be truly an important key to stopping hunger! We are excited that the government agent who taught them these things lives right there among them and made himself available to help show them more farming techniques when the time comes! Pray for a good harvest next spring. Planting season is right around the corner!
