We were very excited to have a crusade in Malakai, Nsanje!

Many of our church members from Bvumbwe and Thekerani made a long journey to join them in this treacherously hot area of Malawi, very near the border with Mozambique. Unfortunately, none of them really knew where they were going, and the bus had a nice scenic detour through a private sugar plantation... and got a police escort to the real route they were looking for. Nevertheless, the turnout for the weekend Crusade with overnight prayers and deliverance services was great. About 150 souls were saved!!!! Our pastor there found himself



homesick, and thus has been sent back. We have positioned two of our strong youth boys on the field there... our Chisomo Kandiado, who has finished school will somehow be heading up the ministry, as his co-hort Joseph is also going to be attending some repeat high school classes in the area along with ministering there.

Pray for these boys. Though they are young, may they be bold. The harvest is truly plentiful. Pray additional youth raise up and can be trained as leaders. There are so many youth and children ready for ministry programs that more servants will be greatly appreciated there.



We were able to see Gloria be dropped off at school!!! She is so excited. The vocational school is a ten month program. She will have a lady that will be her specific care giver the whole time.

The school officials were very welcoming and kind. Pray that as she learns all that they have to teach her about surviving and making it in life, despite certain setbacks, and that she will find great success!

After the Crusade, our church in Thekerani relinquished the land back to Navitcha and his family and were able to purchase our own land, mold bricks, and begin

building a new church. The church is growing, and our pastor is doing great. Such situations can be trying, but God is always in control. We were able to do a food distribution for the members there. Hunger continues to be a serious problem. We are hoping, and you may pray with us, that other people with adjoining



properties will be willing to sell and we can establish a type of farm or area where some more permanent sustenance can be found.



We will start the more serious distribution schedule soon with the rice we purchased in May.

We were able to distribute T-shirts to our amazing members!! Here is the congregation in Thekerani. Our Pastor, Victor Namasenda is front and center.



OcWe have been able to secure a location to be meeting for ministry in Mulanje. That branch continues to grow. Two boys go and minister there every Thursday. The people have been enjoying God's blessing and confirmation of His servants there, as one woman who was barren conceived right after the first time our boys were there and prayed for her!
